The Cub Scouting Program

The Cub Scouting Program is a year around program that boys can join at anytime. It's flexible enough to work with other programs that boys may also be involved in.



Tiger Cubs (1st Grade)

For boys and parents. Work on big ideas to search, discover, and share. Objectives are to prepare families for Cub Scouting. Boys and Parents work one-on-one with other families.



Cub Scouting (2nd & 3rd Grades)

Family centered program. Boys meet regularly in small groups to work on projects. Learning is achieved through an advancement program. Uniforms, badges, games, sports, fun!



Webelos Scouting (4th & 5th Grades)

Begin outdoor experiences. Boys meet regularly with adult leaders. Learning is achieved through a hobby and life skills program called activity badges.
